Physical Therapy

Evaluation and treatment of neuromuscular and musculoskeletal conditions that create functional limitations or disabilities due to trauma, a disorder, or disease process. Physical therapists evaluate and treat clients for limitations in strength, range of motion, gait, endurance, pain, gross motor development, balance, coordination, movement, posture and the need for orthotics. A pediatric therapist will help children master their gross motor skills and order durable medical equipment including specialized seating and wheelchairs.



Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapy begins with first evaluating where an individual is in relation to how their time is spent and then treats the area of deficit to restore normal function.

The areas that occupational therapy evaluates would include; Sensory function (vestibular, tactile, proprioception), Reflex integration, Fine motor skills- hand strength, grasp, release, reach and hand function, Visual motor skills, eye hand coordination, Perceptual motor skills, Self-care skills- dressing, grooming, Range of motion, Oral motor, Behavior issues due to processing, and Coordination issues



Speech & Language Therapy

Provides intervention for a variety of communication disorders. Specific areas of concern are receptive language, the ability to attend, recognize, comprehend and retain information, expressive language functioning, involving vocabulary, word retrieval, grammar and the ability to formulate complete organized thoughts and articulatory functioning, which utilizes the oral mechanics (oral motor control and musculature strength) to produce sounds into clear words. Communication can be complex involving other areas of concern such as pragmatics, the ability to socialize with family and peers, behavior, play and fluency, voice and prosody of speech production. A Speech and Language Pathologist may also be involved with additional medical diagnoses, such as autism, cerebral palsy, hearing impaired (cochlear implants), auditory processing, apraxia, dysarthria, Down Syndrome and children with physical and occupational delays.
